- Assist with residence move-in and orientation programming.
- Attend and participate to the fullest extent in Orientation Week.

Expectations

Orientation Leaders Must:

- Be a registered MSVU student who will
- Have a minimum GPA of 1.7
- Be available and commit to volunteering during September Orientation week.
- Be available and commit to Shinerama and Shine Day in September.
- Complete required training dates.

Estimated Time Commitment:

<u>Training</u>: The two to three days directly preceding the start of Orientation Week in September. Schedule and times TBA.

<u>Orientation Week</u>: Each September with a minimum of 20 hours throughout the week including arrival/move in day between the hours of 12 noon and 11pm.

Shinerama: Shine Day from 9am to 5pm.

General Duties and Responsibilities

- A detailed explanation of orientation week and leader responsibilities will be provided at various Orientation Leader information sessions.
- Work with the Senior Leaders to guide new students in icebreakers, meetings about Orientation and the Mount as well as take Orientation groups to all events/meetings/ workshops scheduled.
- Staffing information booths, Orientation Kit tables etc. during Orientation week.
- Throughout the first semester, each Orientation Leader will have their Frosh group on e-mail/Facebook. Acting in a mentorship role, Orientation Leaders will keep in touch with their students, remind the group of up-coming events and services available to them and organize activities for the group at least once each term.
- Being part of the M-Team and an Orientation Leader is a year long commitment. You are
 expected to continue the support of first year students throughout the entire academic
 year by engaging students as leaders, setting a good example by attending events, exhibiting school spirit and pride and promoting student life to your fellow students.

Designations

If necessary, interviews will be held in January of each year with training for Senior Leaders scheduled throughout the second academic term and a minimum of three days prior to Frosh Week. Training for General Leaders, runners and Orientation Assistants will take place at the Orientation Leader training retreat prior to Frosh Week.
